

Rules and Regulations for the allotment garden adopted by the annual meeting 15th of March 2021. Rules for allotments in Uppsala Municipality https://www.uppsala.se/kommun-och-politik/publikationer/regler-for-fritidsodling-i-uppsala-kommun-eng/ have been incorporated.

Common Rules

- * Each member must abide by these regulations, the statutes of the gardening association and the leasing contract;
- * The Regulations have been drawn up and approved by the gardening association;
- * Each member is required to cultivate the allocated plot in adherence to accepted ecological and environmentally-friendly principles' without use of chemical fertilizers;
- * Traffic-rules apply: it is not allowed to use walking or bicycle paths for motor vehicles without issued dispensation (from the Municipality).

Responsibility for Common Space

- * The member is responsible for disposing of any rubbish on their own plot;
- * The member may use the wheelbarrow and water hoses as well as other tools belonging to the gardening association, and has to return them in the same condition in which they were found;
- * Each member is required to participate in common work around the plots such as general cleaning and tidying of the area.

Care for your own plot

- * The plot may not be used for commercial purposes;
- * The plot is mainly to be used for cultivation with only a small part being set aside for paths and sitting areas;
- * The plot must be well maintained and clean with any grass around the plot being kept cut and free from weeds;
- * Soil preparation and planting work should be completed by *no later than the* 1st of June;
- * Containers for tools and supports for plants are permitted as long as they do not shade neighbouring plots;
- * Members may only store their compost on their own plots; it is not allowed to compost food waste on the plot;
- * Hot beds or greenhouses may not exceed 0, 9 meters from the ground level. During the growing season a temporary greenhouse not exceeding 6 square meters and 1, 5 meters in height may be set up; **Glass may not be used**;
- * Bushes or trees may not be more than 1, 5 meters and fences around the plot may be no more than 0, 9 meters in height and they must not shade a neighbouring plot; fences should be approved by the Committee before put up;
- * The member is responsible for any third-party damage or injury;
- * The deposit will be repaid if the plot is cleaned from weeds and in good order when the member leaves it, otherwise the deposit is forfeited. Perennials and bushes of berries may be left on the plot.
